## Carrier Hosts a Variety of Activities and Contests in April to Commemorate Earth Day and National Volunteer Week

#### April 15-30: National Wildlife Refuge Association Volunteer Opportunities

#### April 18: Dream Green Getaway Contest

That's equal to the weight of nearly 165 Boeing 737-700 aircraft. #### April 25: Composting Lunch & Learn, Dallas

Southwest is hosting a Composting Lunch & Learn at its Headquarters to educate attendees on how to discover the recipe to compost, or what gardeners affectionately like to call "black gold," since it's full of nutrients. Along with learning how to compost and reduce the amount of waste that ultimately ends up in landfills, Southwest will be giving away 200 free compost bins donated by the City of Dallas.
