The office offers a full array of consumer and business banking and lending solutions, and now features dual-function video teller machines and ATMs. Enhanced video teller technology in the drive-in provides providing more options and extended service hours to better support the varied needs of clients.

Video teller technology enables live assistance from a banker via video chat and is available to Capital City Bank clients with or without a debit card from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. on Saturday. The machines are equipped with a Smart ATM option for self-service banking with a debit card 24 hours a day. The Smart ATM has all the standard features of a traditional ATM but includes several key enhancements that make it easier, faster and more convenient than ever before. It accepts cash and check deposits up to 30 items in a single transaction, and checks post same day when deposited by 8 p.m. on business days.
