

## Southwest Airlines Will not Resume Operations to/from New Orleans Before Noon on Thursday

DALLAS, Sept. 2 /PRNewswire-FirstCall/ -- Southwest Airlines said today that it will not operate flights to and from New Orleans' Louis Armstrong International Airport on Wednesday, Sept. 3, and the soonest the airline could resume operations will be Noon Central Time on Thursday, Sept. 4. Plans to resume service to and from New Orleans will depend upon the status of airport security personnel, facilities, and services.
