

## Equinix Political Contributions Report

Under Equinix's Political Contributions Policy, we are committed to reporting the details of any contribution—including identification of the organization or candidate, and amount contributed—in a political contributions report published on a semi-annual basis. This report also discloses details of our trade associations where membership dues exceed \$50,000.

### January 2022

The following report reflects political contribution activities by Equinix for the six months between **July 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021**.

#### Political contributions:

- Equinix currently does not have a corporate Political Action Committee (PAC).
- For the time period between July 1, 2021, through December 31, 2021, Equinix did not make any contributions at any level of government to political campaigns, political parties, or other organizations that are involved in political campaigns.
- As required under the Lobby Disclosure Act, Equinix filed its Lobbying Contribution Report (report form LDA-203) with the U.S. Congress in January 2022. This filing covers activities from July 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021. The Lobby Contribution Report requires entities to disclose PACs that they control as well as contributions of more than \$200 made to federal candidates and other PACs, federal campaigns, and party committees. Entities are also required to disclose contributions made to events or organizations that are named for or are in honor of congressional or executive branch officials.
- The Equinix Lobby Contribution Report, accordingly, indicates that no political contributions were made in the specified time period. The report can be found [here](#).

#### Trade association participation:

- Equinix belongs to one trade association to which it pays membership dues of more than \$50,000. That trade association is the Information Technology Industry Council (ITI; [www.itic.org](http://www.itic.org)). Equinix paid dues of \$125,000 to ITI for the entire year of 2021.
