Reichert's work at Merck and Schering-Plough has helped shape the pharmaceutical industry's understanding of molecular behavior, formulation challenges, and drug development pathways.

Werkheiser advises across the commercial space ecosystem - drawing from three decades of experience successfully leading space programs and partnerships from concept to operations on space shuttles, the International Space Station (ISS), and the lunar surface. Most recently, she served as NASA's director of technology maturation, where she oversaw more than \$1.5B in technology investments across industry and government. Previously, she

established NASA's In-Space Manufacturing Initiative as a foundational capability for long-duration missions.

SpaceMD leverages the unique microgravity environment in space using its innovative and flight-proven Pharmaceutical In-Space Laboratory (PIL-BOX) technology to grow seed crystals in space, for subsequent sale or licensing to companies that can use them to reformulate existing drugs or develop entirely new therapeutics. Since the first PIL-BOX launch in November 2023, 54 PIL-BOX systems have flown to the ISS, successfully crystallizing 45 unique compounds, including insulin and other critical molecules for treating diseases like cancer, cardiovascular disease, obesity, and diabetes.
