This week, Cobra moved 46 FTE into the Yabucoa region as jobs were completed or near complete in other areas. Cobra also began mobilization of 100 FTE to the island to be in place and working by May 31. They did this absent the new contract, absent a new amendment, and

absent getting caught up in payment. I raise this because with the additional FTE they are going to reach their cap on their emergency contact by June 15.

On Saturday, May 19, the following will occur:

- 49 PREPA line workers will be mobilizing to work the PowerSecure circuits. At this time, PREPA management does not require line work on Sundays, so they will work Saturday and be back on the job on Monday. FEMA has asked if it is possible to allow for Sunday working. We have no response yet. Attached is the transition plan for Utuado.
- USACE, PowerSecure, PREPA, FEMA, and Cobra will meet to transition work packages from PowerSecure to PREPA and Cobra. In addition, Cobra has begun assessments for the new crews coming in. Also note, they are bringing different equipment to attack the tough areas. There is a lot of helicopter work required in Utuado as well.

BIGGEST ISSUE:

— The Cobra and MasTec contracts are not yet approved after four months. We need to put as much pressure on the that system as we are on the transfer of operations. We allowed sufficient time to complete this transition and it is still not done.
