Carlos Torres

Beginning in 1985, Mr. Torres worked for 32 years at Consolidated Edison of New York, including over nine years as Vice President for Emergency Preparedness and Business Resilience (2008-2017). Mr. Torres retired from Con Edison on October 31, 2017. Mr. Torres was retained as a consultant by the Edison Electric Institute to provide advice and assistance in connection with restoring the power grid in Puerto Rico after Hurricane Maria hit the island on September 20, 2017. In that capacity, he traveled to Puerto Rico to assess the damage, including thorough discussions with various agencies and individuals, including Ricardo Rossello, who was then the Governor of Puerto Rico. Governor Rossello appointed Mr. Torres Power Restoration Coordinator ("PRC") for the emergency restoration of electrical power in Puerto Rico.
