Review of NMFC

Overview

- Founded in October 2008 to apply New Mountain Capital, L.L.C.'s ("NMC" or "New Mountain") private equity strengths to attractive risk-reward opportunities in the U.S. debt markets
 - New Mountain is a leading private equity firm with more than \$15 billion of assets under management⁽¹⁾ and ~100 staff members
- Externally managed Business Development Company ("BDC")
 - Initial Public Offering ("IPO") completed in May 2011 (NYSE: NMFC)
 - Public float market cap has increased from \$147 million at IPO to \$848 million as of March 31, 2015
- Targets investments up to a \$50 million hold size in:
 - "Defensive growth" middle market companies, typically generating \$20 – \$200 million of EBITDA
 - Senior secured debt (1st lien, 2nd lien or uni-tranche), mezzanine and other subordinated securities

Strategy

- NMFC's mandate is to primarily target businesses in the middle market that, consistent with New Mountain's private equity platform, are <u>quality, defensive growth</u> companies, in industries that are <u>well-researched</u> by New Mountain
- Mandate achieved by <u>utilizing existing New Mountain</u> <u>investment team</u> as primary underwriting resource; team combines operating executives with financial executives
- Target loan to value ratios typically average less than 50% of both sponsor purchase price and NMC valuation

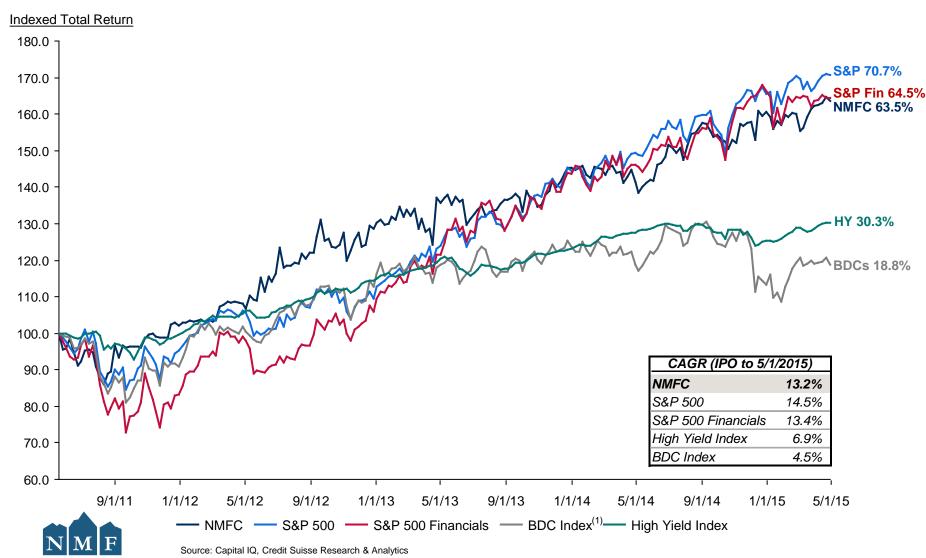

May 19, 2011 (IPO) – May 1, 2015



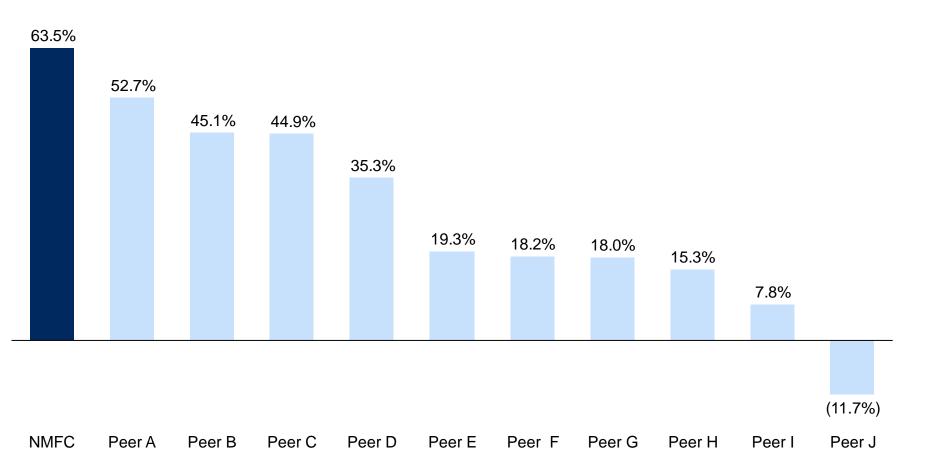

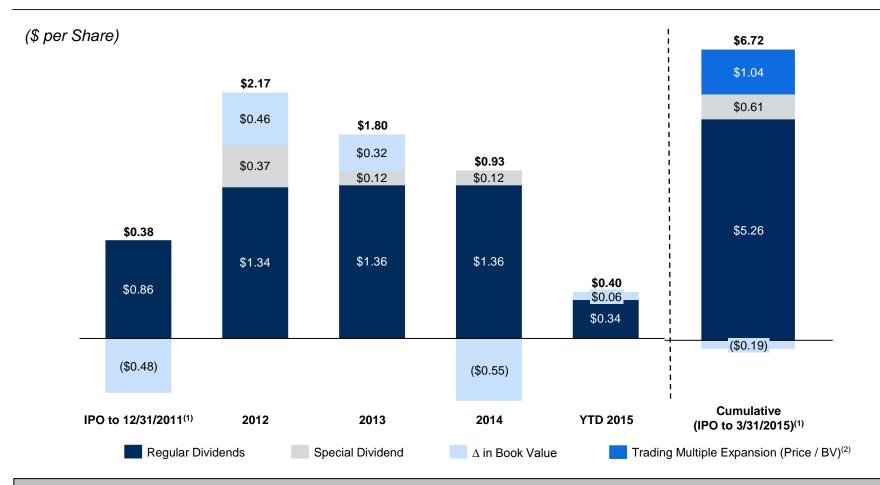
NMFC Cumulative Total Return Performance Versus Peers⁽¹⁾

Credit Market Conditions

- Credit spreads have started to narrow since our last call
 - Primarily driven by reduced supply in the market
 - Stabilization in retail fund flows
- With limited exceptions, smaller deals continue to be priced at a premium
- NMFC works to be well positioned to capitalize on volatile markets:
 - NMC and NMFC have <u>always</u> proactively focused on defensive, acyclical business models
 - Wells Fargo leverage facility <u>not</u> subject to margin calls

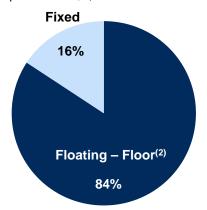


Credit Market Conditions – Interest Rates

Floating vs. Fixed

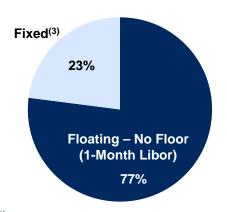


(Aggregate par value of \$1,398.8 million as of 3/31/2015)(1)

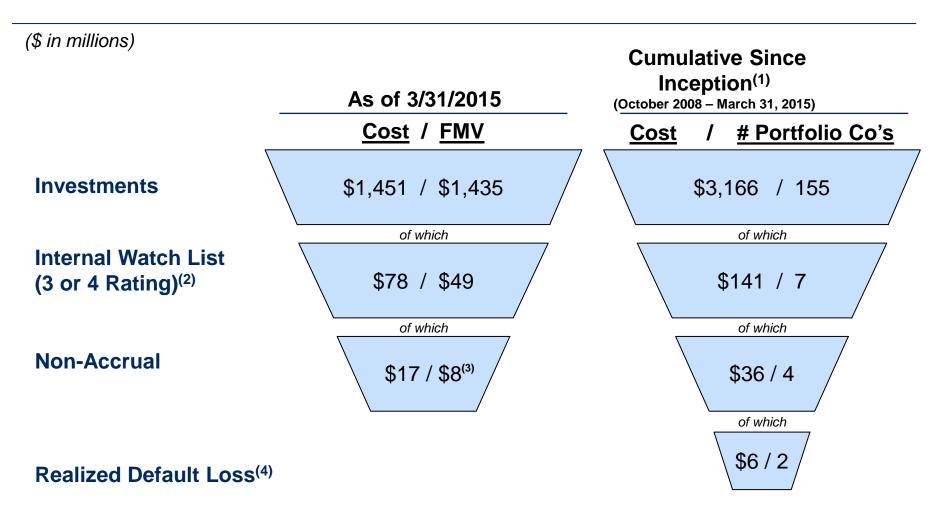

Edmentum Update

- As noted on our prior call, Edmentum, Inc. released a very weak FY2015 budget and indicated that financial covenants would be violated
 - NMFC owns \$31.2 million of the second lien debt; position marked at 50 since December 31, 2014
- On April 20, 2015, Edmentum announced a unanimous restructuring agreement among its first lien lenders, second lien lenders and equity sponsors
 - Expected to close in the next few weeks and is still subject to the execution of definitive documentation
- Key terms of the restructuring are in line with our original expectations
 - Second lien lenders exchange existing debt for new PIK securities and substantially all of the equity in the reorganized company
 - Also provide a modest amount of new capital to the business (NMFC's funded share ~\$5 million)
 - First lien lenders significantly relax covenants in exchange for a modest paydown and rate boost
- NMFC continues to take a lead role in the discussions and brings significant ed-tech private equity resources to bear

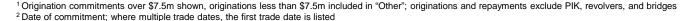

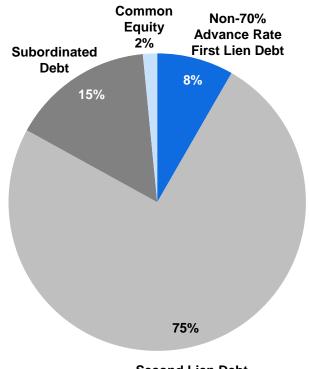

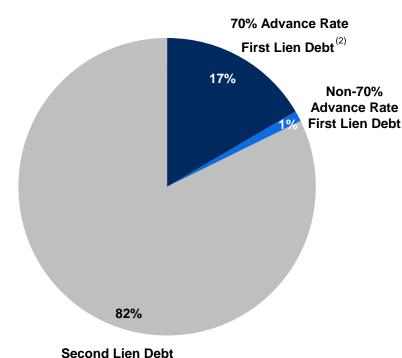
Q1 2015 Originations and Repayments

Sales / Repayments by Type(1)



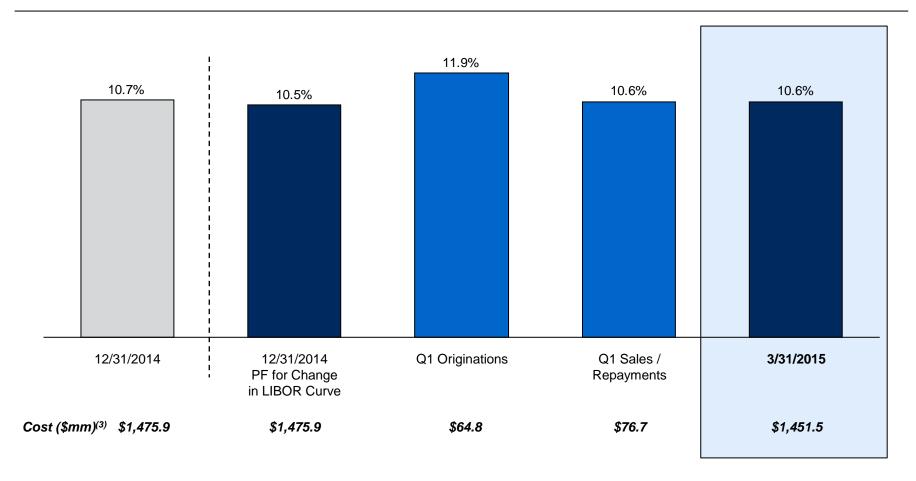






Q1 2015 Investment Activity Roll

YTM at Cost⁽¹⁾ / Purchase⁽²⁾

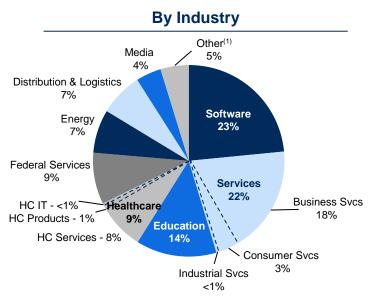




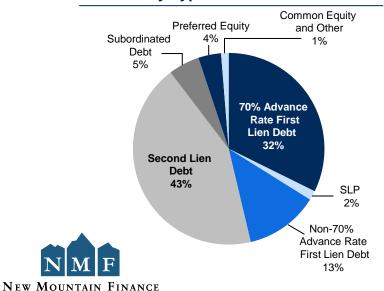

Portfolio Mix (By Fair Value as of 3/31/2015)

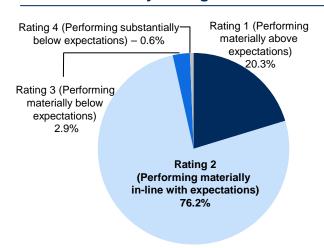


By Type of Investment



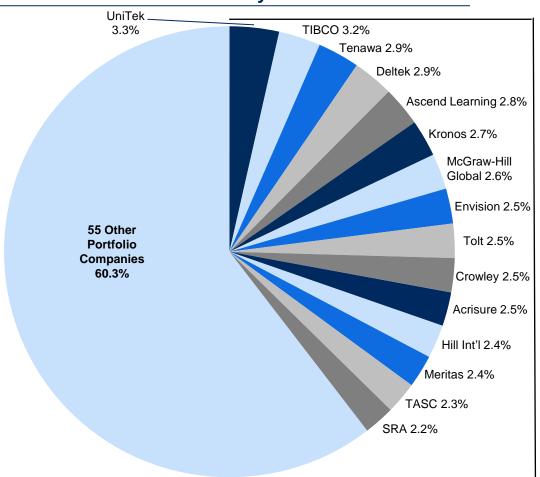

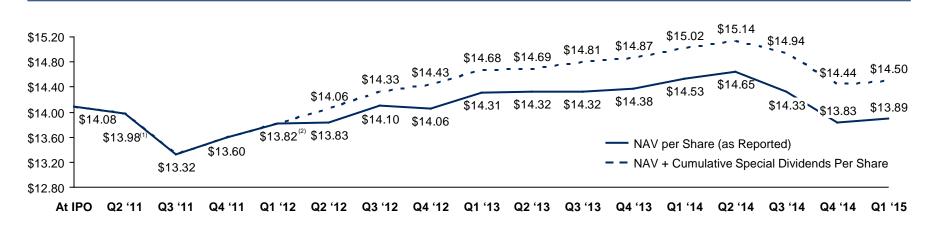

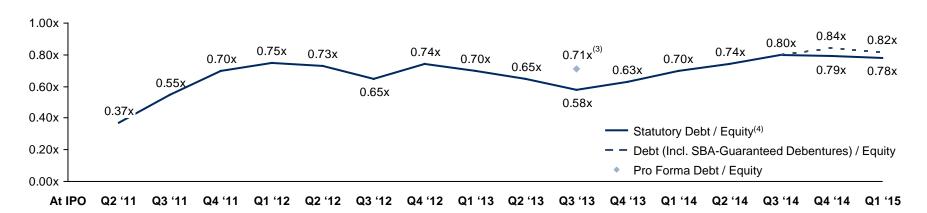

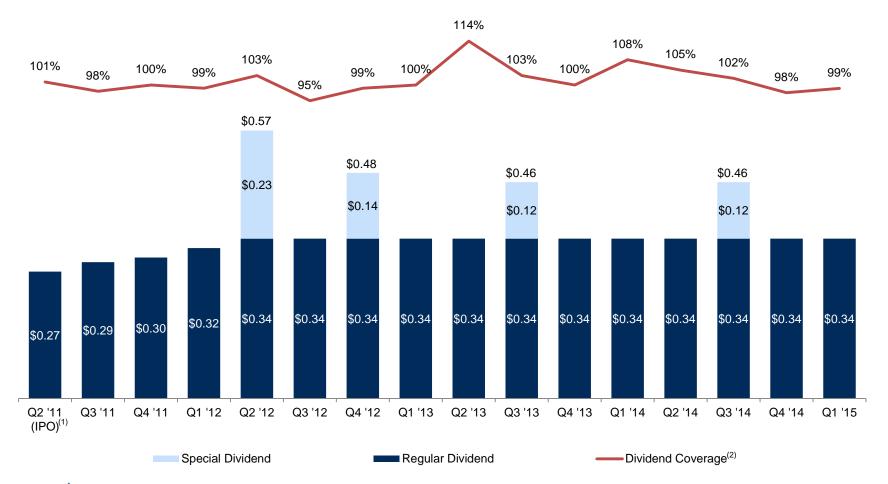
