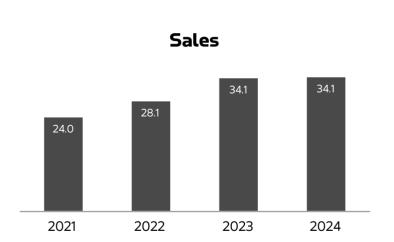

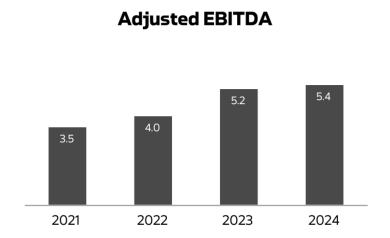

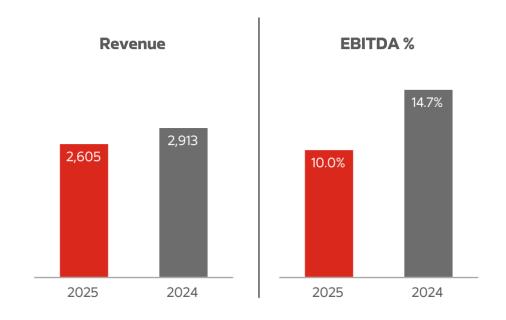

Engine Segment - Selected Financial Data



Q3-25 Highlights

- Revenue decreased 11% due to lower Heavy Duty and Medium Duty demand in North America.
- EBITDA margin decreased as lower volumes and unfavorable tariff impacts were partially offset by favorable pricing in light-duty markets.

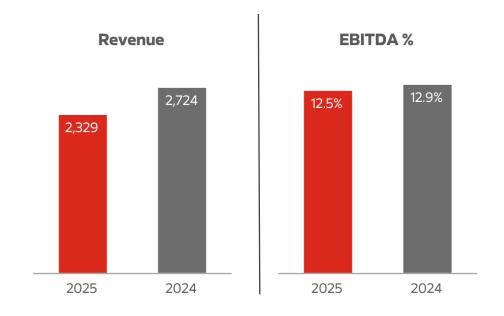


Components Segment - Selected Financial Data



Q3-25 Highlights

- Revenue decreased 15% primarily due to lower On-Highway demand in North America.
- EBITDA margin decreased as lower volumes were partially offset by decreased freight costs.

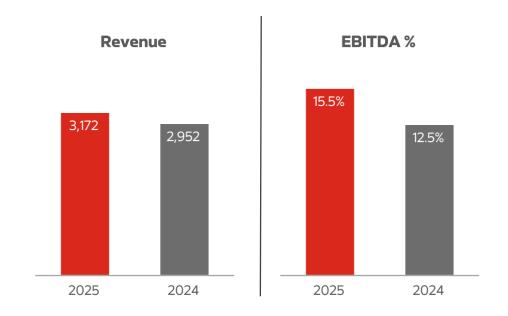


Distribution Segment - Selected Financial Data



Q3-25 Highlights

- Revenue increased 7% driven by increased demand for power generation products in North America.
- EBITDA margin increased primarily due to higher power generation volumes and favorable pricing.

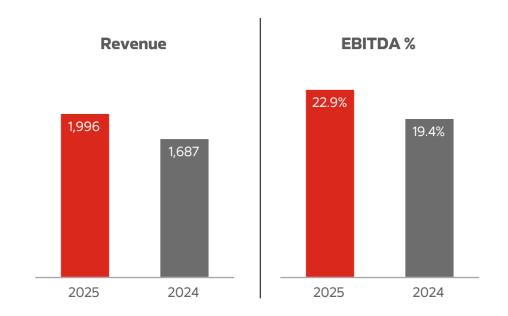


Power Systems Segment - Selected Financial Data

- Revenue increased 18% driven primarily by increased power generation demand, particularly for data center applications.
- EBITDA margin increased as higher volumes and favorable pricing more than offset unfavorable tariff impacts.

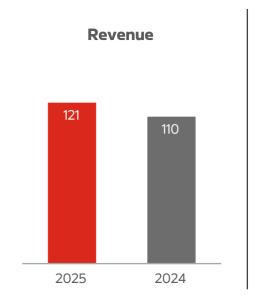


Accelera Segment - Selected Financial Data

- Revenue increased due to higher eMobility demand.
- EBITDA losses are driven by costs associated with the development of electric powertrains, fuel cells and electrolyzers, as well as products to support battery electric vehicles.

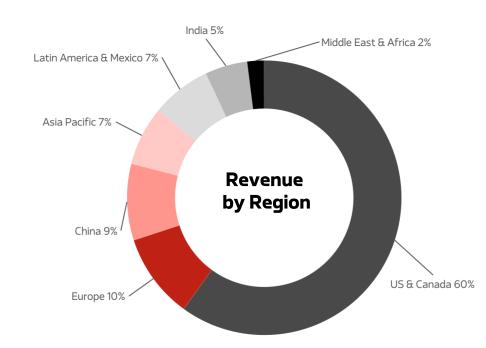
