CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

Desktop Metal, Inc. and its subsidiaries (“Desktop Metal”) are committed to ethical practices and compliance with applicable laws and regulations wherever it does business. Desktop Metal views managing our obligations relative to the use of identified conflict minerals (tantalum, tungsten, tin, and gold) as part of its corporate responsibility.

Desktop Metal supports the goals of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, which requires public companies to exercise diligence over the supply chains of products they manufacture, and wishes to reinforce industry efforts supporting such goals. To this end, Desktop Metal has established this Conflict Mineral Policy seeking to prevent the use of conflict minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or an adjoining country (the “Covered Region”).

In furtherance of these goals, Desktop Metal requests that all vendors in its supply chain comply with the following requirements:

- Suppliers are to establish appropriate policies, data exchange methods, due diligence frameworks, risk mitigation strategies, and management systems designed to accomplish the goal of supply chain transparency. These should be consistent with an internationally recognized diligence framework, such as the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas and its applicable supplements (see www.oecd.org/daf/inv/mne/mining.htm).
- Suppliers will work with sub-suppliers to attain traceability of conflict minerals to the smelter level by, for example, using the EICC-GeSI Conflict Minerals Reporting Template and Dashboard (see materials located at www.responsiblemineralsinitiative.org).

In compliance with Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, Desktop Metal files annual disclosures to the Securities and Exchange Commission regarding whether any conflict minerals that are necessary to the functionality or production of our products originated in the Covered Region.
