WNTP Announces Signal Upgrade

Improvements Will Increase Listener Experience

PHILADELPHIA--(BUSINESS WIRE)--

News Talk 990 AM WNTN announced today the completion of a multi-year project to further improve the Philadelphia-based station's 50,000 watt signal.

"Following an FCC-approved study of WNTN's coverage area, we determined that our coverage area could be expanded," reports WNTN Vice President and General Manager Russ Whitnah. "Under Chief Engineer Rene Tetro's leadership, we upgraded and improved reception in the Chester, eastern Berks, northern Montgomery, and Bucks County areas. In addition, a new broadband antenna system was installed to improve the sound fidelity of the station."
