Archbishop Timothy Dolan and Rabbi Harlan J. Wechsler to Host Interfaith Special on SIRIUS XM

Two religious leaders engage in a dialogue on faith and the holidays in today's world, take calls from listeners across the country

Archbishop Dolan and Rabbi Wechsler will also answer questions from both a live studio audience and callers around the country.
