

Shapeways is committed to ensuring that the products it sells do not incorporate "conflict minerals," which are minerals smelted into tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold (3TGs) sourced from entities which directly or indirectly finance conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo or its adjoining countries.

In parallel with our Corporate Code of Conduct, we endeavor to provide conflict-free products and support industry-wide efforts to encourage transparency in the supply chain.

Additionally, Shapeways expects its suppliers to:

- perform sufficient due diligence into their respective supply chains to determine whether products sold to us contain tin, tantalum, tungsten or gold, and, if so, whether and to what extent those metals are sourced from conflict-free smelters;
- report to Shapeways the results of such due diligence to enable Shapeways to comply with its legal obligations and policy goals; and
- commit to being or becoming "conflict-free," so that any such metals are sourced only from conflict-free smelters.

If any of Shapeways' suppliers have difficulties in complying with this policy, Shapeways will attempt to work with the supplier to address these difficulties.

Shapeways intends to fully comply with the requirements of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, which requires that Shapeways performs due diligence into the sources of such minerals, and disclose the results of such diligence.
