Subsequent to the ExxonMobil merger, he was appointed president of ExxonMobil Gas & Power Marketing Company in December 1999. He was appointed president of ExxonMobil Production Company in July 2003.

A native of Australia, Dr. McGill holds a bachelor's degree and a doctorate in chemical engineering from Sydney University. Dr. McGill is a fellow of the Institution of Chemical Engineers and a member of the Society of Petroleum Engineers.
