# **Detroit Area Banks and Credit Unions Join With Gleaners Community Food Bank to Fight Area Hunger**

## **Financial Institutions Put Aside Rivalries in Spirit of Holidays to Help with Donation Shortfall**

TROY, Mich., Dec. 10 /PRNewswire-FirstCall/ -- 'Tis the season for normally competitive area banks and credit unions to join together and help Gleaners Community Food Bank overcome a shortfall in donations.
