Overview of Third Quarter 2016

- Revenue increased 10 percent -- on a constant currency basis¹, sales increased by 10 percent. Strong growth in fitness, all three of our primary boat categories and marine parts & accessories as well as solid growth in outboard engines
- Gross margin of 28.3 percent
- Operating expenses increased by 11 percent²
- Adjusted operating earnings² increased by 8 percent compared to prior year, with operating margins down 30 basis points, as expected
- Adjusted pretax earnings² increased by 8 percent
- Diluted EPS, as adjusted², of \$0.91, up \$0.14, or 18 percent
- Year-to-date free cash flow of \$158 million reflected an improvement of \$27 million versus prior year




