Portfolio fair value decreased 6% primarily due to change in ACV Auctions' market value, and stock sales.

Mix at quarter-end, based on fair value:

55% Fixed-rate debt investments

35% Equity investments in private companies

10% Publicly traded equities (includes dividend paying BDCs and ACV Auctions stock)

Sold remaining interest in Microcision; liquidated two BDC investments

Utilized funds to make a \$2.2 million debt investment in the quarter

Liquidated two publicly traded BDC's for total proceeds of \$922,000 and a gain of \$171,000




Sold 86,000 shares at average price of \$14.24 per share for net realized gain of \$1.2 million


Investments by Industry Classification

Total investment income grew 67%

 Driven by increased interest income from portfolio companies and higher dividend income

Total expenses included capital gains incentive fee credit of \$663 thousand in Q2 22 vs \$1.1 million expense in Q2 21

Excluding the capital gains incentive fee, adjusted expenses were up 1% to \$567 thousand³

 Reflects higher professional fees, largely offset with the elimination of interest expense payments for the SBA obligations, which were paid off in full in December 2021


