## **Novelis Contributes \$250,000 To Hurricane Katrina Relief Efforts**

ATLANTA, Sept. 2 /PRNewswire-FirstCall/ -- Novelis Inc. (NYSE: NVL; TSX) announced today that it has contributed \$250,000 to the American Red Cross to support emergency relief efforts in the wake of Hurricane Katrina.

Novelis has also spearheaded an effort to respond collectively via The Aluminum Association to provide canned water for the relief efforts. More than 250,000 cans of water are already being shipped as part of this effort. Novelis has committed to donate aluminum sheet for the production of a further two million cans of water for the next wave of relief efforts.

In addition, Novelis has contacted several of its major U.S. industrial customers to offer emergency supply of aluminum for any sort of donated material they may offer for the construction of temporary housing or future rebuilding efforts.

Novelis is also encouraging its employees to make personal contributions through the American Red Cross.
