

News/Talk Station to Be Introduced in Philadelphia on April 5

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CAMARILLO, Calif.--(<u>BUSINESS WIRE</u>)--Feb. 25, 2004--Salem Communications Corporation (Nasdaq:SALM), the leading radio broadcaster focused on religious and family themes programming, announced today that it will introduce new news/talk stations in Philadelphia and Dallas. Beginning April 5, WNTP-AM (990AM) (formerly WZZD) in Philadelphia, and KSKY-AM (660AM) in Dallas will provide listeners enhanced programming featuring popular radio personalities Hugh Hewitt, Dennis Prager, Michael Medved and Mike Gallagher, among others.

Edward G. Atsinger III, Salem's chief executive officer, said, "The launch of these new news/talk formats in Philadelphia and Dallas represents a significant growth opportunity for Salem, and is part of our long-term plan of developing our three formats. We expect them to complement very effectively our other stations in these markets, and to deliver strong operating performance."

According to Russ Whitnah, general manager of WFIL-AM and WZZD-AM in Philadelphia, the introduction of news/talk will allow Salem to bring the best in both Christian teaching and talk, and news/talk to the listeners of Philadelphia, southern New Jersey and northern Delaware regions.

"Historically, WFIL-AM and WNTP-AM offered listeners similar programming in the Christian teaching and talk format. Our listeners now will enjoy the best of both worlds: Christian teaching and talk; and news/talk," Whitnah said. "Our market has waited for an intelligent talk format, right at the intersection of politics, pop culture and American values. At the same time, our Christian-formatted station gets even stronger, with the addition of so many strong WNTP-AM ministry programs to WFIL-AM."

Whitnah noted that the stations will continue broadcasting collegiate football and basketball, and will seek to expand its live sports coverage in the greater Philadelphia area.
