

Employee Stock Options

Our stock option plans are part of a broad-based, long-term retention program that is intended to attract and retain talented employees and directors and align stockholder and employee interests.

The 2001 Stock Option Plan (2001 Plan) was adopted and replaced the 1991 Stock Option Plan (1991 Plan), which expired in August 2001. In March 2004, stockholders approved an amendment to increase the share reserve of the 2001 Plan by 32 million shares. Options granted under the 1991 Plan remain outstanding until exercised or cancelled. Pursuant to the 2001 Plan, the Board of Directors may grant options to selected employees, directors and consultants to purchase shares of our common stock at a price not less than the fair market value of the stock at the date of grant. The 2001 Plan provides for the grant of both incentive stock options and non-qualified stock options. Generally, options outstanding vest over periods not exceeding six years and are exercisable for up to ten years from the grant date. The 2001 Non-Employee Directors' Stock Option Plan (2001 Directors' Plan) was adopted and replaced the 1998 Non-Employee Directors' Stock Option Plan (1998 Directors' Plan). Options granted under the 1998 Directors' Plan remain outstanding until exercised or cancelled. The 2001 Directors' Plan provides for non-qualified stock options to be granted to non-employee directors at an exercise price of not less than fair market value, vesting over periods not exceeding five years and exercisable for up to ten years from the grant date. The Board of Directors may terminate the 2001 Plan and/or the 2001 Directors' Plan at any time though it must nevertheless honor any stock options previously granted pursuant to the plans.
