

Employee Stock Options

Our stock option plans are part of a broad-based, long-term retention program that is intended to attract and retain talented employees and directors and align stockholder and employee interests.

The 2001 Stock Option Plan (2001 Plan) was adopted and replaced the 1991 Stock Option Plan (1991 Plan), which expired in August 2001. In March 2004, stockholders approved an amendment to increase the share reserve of the 2001 Plan by 32 million shares. Options granted under the 1991 Plan remain outstanding until exercised or cancelled. Pursuant to the 2001 Plan, the Board of Directors may grant options to selected employees, directors and consultants to purchase shares of our common stock at a price not less than the fair market value of the stock at the date of grant. The 2001 Plan provides for the grant of both incentive stock options and non-qualified stock options. Generally, options outstanding vest over periods not exceeding five years and are exercisable for up to 10 years from the grant date. The 2001 Non-Employee Directors' Stock Option Plan (2001 Directors' Plan) was adopted and replaced the 1998 Non-Employee Directors' Stock Option Plan (1998 Directors' Plan). Options granted under the 1998 Directors' Plan remain outstanding until exercised or cancelled. The 2001 Directors' Plan provides for non-qualified stock options to be granted to non-employee directors at an exercise price of not less than fair market value, vesting over periods not exceeding five years and exercisable for up to 10 years from the grant date. The Board of Directors may terminate the 2001 Plan and/or the 2001 Directors' Plan at any time though it must nevertheless honor any stock options previously granted pursuant to the plans.

⁽¹⁾ Consists of six plans: the Company's 1991 Stock Option Plan, 2001 Stock Option Plan, 1998 Non-Employee Directors' Stock Option Plan, 2001 Non-Employee Directors' Stock Option Plan, 2001 Employee Stock Purchase Plan and the Executive Retirement Matching Contribution Plan.

⁽²⁾ Includes approximately 15 million shares reserved for issuance under the 2001 Employee Stock Purchase Plan.

⁽³⁾ Consists solely of approximately 87,000 shares issuable under the Company's 1996 Non-Qualified Employee Stock Purchase Plan, which allows eligible employees to purchase shares of common stock at 85% of the lower of the fair market value on the first or the last day of each six-month offering period. Employees may authorize the Company to withhold up to 15% of their compensation during any offering period, subject to certain limitations.

⁽⁴⁾ Excludes options assumed in connection with mergers and acquisitions. Approximately 767,000 shares of the Company's common stock were issuable upon exercise of these assumed options. These options have a weighted average exercise price of \$20.32 per share. No additional options may be granted under these assumed arrangements.
